MEN'S RETREAT CAMP

Program Overview

During this program, 8th grade students come to an abiler house on Sundays and stay there until Tuesday. The older brothers in charge bring the kids from the house to the school and back.


During their three day weekly stay, the students go outside for activities on Sunday, followed by islamic lessons. During the morning, on Mondays and Tuesdays, the students start off their day with Fajr and breakfast, followed by making their own lunch. Afterwards, the older brothers drop off the students at school.

In the afternoon, the students pray Dhuhr, followed by free time. Afterwards, they eat dinner and finish their homework. After homework, the students resume their islamic studies and Quran classes.

The Mid-Atlantic mentors and aspiring mentors came together for a meaningful and impactful program that combined learning, collaboration, and community spirit. The event provided valuable insights and created an environment where participants could connect and share their experiences together.

Everyone left with joy in their hearts, full stomachs, and a renewed sense of energy. It was truly a yippy start to a semester that promises both learning and lasting bonds.




BOYS & GIRLS MENTORING PROGRAM KICKOFF




Fundraising activities were enacted for the tutoring center to be opened.
